WHY?

Multi-use paths and their connections to communities are critical links in Cape Cod's transportation network. Whether for work or pleasure thousands of individuals use these multi-use paths and connections each year. Significant planning resources are dedicated to improving and extending these facilities, but success of projects depends on bicycle and pedestrian count data. As an engaged citizen you can make a difference. The Cape Cod Commission is seeking volunteers to conduct bicycle and pedestrian counts across Cape Cod to supplement the Commission's counting program. You can help shape the future for bicyclists and pedestrians on Cape Cod.

WHERE?

There are locations across Cape Cod in need of volunteers to gather new count data. Visit the program website at www.capecodcommission.org/initiatives/bikeped for a list of priority locations or contact Commission staff or call (508) 362-3282 and ask to speak with the Bicycle and Pedestrian Counting Program. When choosing where to sit or park your car or bike be sure to be considerate of neighbors and always be safe.

WHEN?

Counts can be conducted at any time, but counts during the summer months are preferred because they typically reflect the heaviest use of the facility. You can pick any time period you are available, but try to pick a time when you expect significant activity. Counts can be taken during a period as short as two hours and can be conducted at your convenience.


HOW?
