The Cape Cod Joint Transportation Committee (CCJTC) is the transportation advisory group to the MPO, and the public discussion of MPO related items is part of the public hearing requirements of FTA's Section 5307 program. This public notice/meeting is to satisfy the FTA Program of Projects requirements. The Cape Cod Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) through the Cape Cod Commission hereby states its policy to uphold and assure full compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, and related federal and state statutes and regulations. Title VI prohibits discrimination in federally assisted programs and requires that no person in the United States of America shall, on the grounds of race, color, or national origin, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be otherwise subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance. Massachusetts law also prohibits discrimination based on race, color, and/or national origin, and the Cape Cod MPO assures compliance with these laws and related federal and state civil rights laws prohibiting discrimination based on sex, age, and/or disability. Individuals who feel they have been discriminated against in violation of Title VI must file a complaint within 180 days with the Cape Cod MPO through the Cape Cod Commission. The Cape Cod MPO also upholds the Massachusetts Public Accommodation Law, M.G.L. c272 §§92a, 98,98a, and the Governor's Executive Order 526, section 4 which provide that access to programs, services and benefits be provided without regard to religious creed, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, veteran's status and/or ancestry, along with the bases previously referenced.
