Called to Order: Acting Chairman and Vice-Chairman Mr. Robert Bersin called the meeting to order at 8:40 AM.

Minutes of August 11, 2000 were approved.

Cape Cod & Islands Rural Roads Initiative: Priscilla Leclerc, CCC Senior Transportation Planner, gave some background information on the progress of the project up to the draft scope. At present we are waiting for MassHighway to move forward on the Memorandum of Agreement. She asked for comments on the "Cape Cod & Islands Rural Roads Scope" information that had been recently mailed out. With a motion by Peter Tancredi, seconded by

Greg Taylor, the CCJTC voted that on Page 5, the last bullet under A. should be changed to "adopt and implement the recommended design guidelines developed for Cape Cod and the Islands." Other areas of discussion included: whether the State task force formed was a duplication of the process; budget concerns, the quarterly newsletter; and extension of the public comment period. It was also mentioned that the Upper Cape project should be done before the Rural Roads work begins. Neil Andres submitted a page of comments from the Barnstable County Public Works Association, Inc. Priscilla Leclerc reported that the CCJTC comments would be forwarded to the Cape & Islands Rural Roads Group.

Cape Cod Regional Policy Plan (RPP): John Lipman, CCC Chief Planner/Deputy Director, gave a brief informative slide presentation on the Regional Policy Plan and encouraged people to attend the upcoming RPP Workshops. After his presentation he asked if anyone had any ideas for changes or additions to the Plan. Greg Taylor, Mashpee, brought up disbursement of mitigation funds. John says he welcomes any future calls or written comments.

Cape Cod 2000 Regional Transportation Plan (RTP): Lev Malakhoff, CCC Senior Transportation Engineer, passed out the following informative handouts: (1)"Public Meetings--Cape Cod Regional Transportation Plan"; (2)"Regional Transportation Plan Development Schedule"; (3)"Cape Cod Regional Transportation Plan-Summary of Considered Projects"; and (4) Five Phased Repairs to Bourne & Sagamore Bridges." Lev noted the final MPO endorsement date of the Plan is January 15th. He also requested any input on the Plan be sent or faxed to him.

Public Comment: There was none.

Other business: Priscilla Leclerc reported on a Regional Transit Plan saying an ad hoc task force formed and she gave a rundown of some of the people on this task force. This ad hoc Transit Task Force will oversee a consultant to put together a Capewide Transit Plan. With the consultant underway soon, public meetings are likely in January/February of next year with the final plan in place around June. She also mentioned the County typically has surplus funds and asked for any input regarding specific requests for use of such funds. One idea was funding for the design of the Cape Cod Rail Trail section from Dennis to Hyannis. Greg Taylor suggested \$100,000 for multi-use bikeways. Enclosed is a draft copy of the Transportation Enhancement Program Guidelines. The procedures for submitting an Enhancement proposal have changed significantly from last year's guidelines. Also, please note a change in funding requirements and project phasing. Although it is not possible to highlight all of the changes, the following are some of the major revisions incorporated into the Guidelines:

- MassHighway will accept Enhancement proposals on an open enrollment basis. Each Regional Planning Agency can determine its own procedures for accepting Enhancement proposals throughout the year.
 - Each Enhancement proposal will be subject to an extensive pre-application process.
 - Applicants requesting funding for a project with more than one Enhancement category (e.g. Final Design, Acquisition, Construction) should submit one application. Prior approval by MassHighway is required for phasing projects by category.
 - Statewide project applicants will be required to submit a letter of intent prior to the pre-application process.
 - Projects will be reimbursed with 80% federal and 10% state funds. The remaining 10% is required as a project match by the sponsor or applicant. This funding mechanism eliminates the 10% overmatch required in previous years' guidelines. Furthermore, state and federal agencies that sponsor projects will be required to contribute 20% of the project cost.
 - The project scoring criteria have been eliminated.

Call to Order Acting Chairman and Vice-Chairman Mr. Robert Bersin called the meeting to order at 8:33 am.

Minutes of July 14, 2000 Mr. Robert Burgmann, Barnstable, requested that the minutes be changed on the CanalSide Commons vote to reflect his abstention. With this change, the minutes were approved.

Cape Cod & Islands Rural Roads Initiative Mr. Robert Mumford, CCC Transportation Program Manager, described the background in the effort to look at developing Cape and Islands design guidelines--the Cape Cod Rural Roads Initiative, a High Priority Project in the *Transportation*

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Equity Act for the 21st Century (TEA-21). A copy of the proposed related items: Memorandum of Agreement (MOA), the scope of work, budget and schedule; had been mailed out to members for this meeting. The general consensus of those present was that this project for Cape & Islands design guidelines should be moving forward. Bob Mumford stated that he welcomes comments on the scope for the Cape & Islands Rural Roads Initiative. Doug Kelleher, MHD, reported that the MHD Commissioner wants to wait for the [statewide] task force on rural roads to make recommendations before proceeding with the Cape & Islands process. The CCJTC members present agreed that the scope should be an item on the next CCJTC meeting agenda.

Cape Cod Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) Mr. Robert Mumford, CCC Transportation Program Manager, described the changes to the UPWP since the last meeting. These changes included the addition of the funding for Executive Order 418 as per MassHighway's request. Mr. Mumford said that he would be meeting with MassHighway on the UPWP and would report any changes to the CCJTC at their next meeting, whether in September or October.

Cape Cod Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) for Federal Fiscal Years 2001-2006 Priscilla Leclerc began presenting the Final Draft TIP. As the slide which included "Other 2001 NFA [non federal aid] projects" was shown [below left, dated August 2000], Priscilla Leclerc tried to state that the MHD comment letter-- received too late yesterday to change this slide-- pointed out that the "Other NFA" regional list should have been constrained to the Non federal aid amount for 2001 which equals \$1,147,500. CCJTC discussion erupted and there was a vote to remove the bike projects from this slide. Priscilla Leclerc continued that the projects on this list will have to be constrained to the \$1,147,500, and the CCJTC recommended phasing of the Route 130 Sandwich project and leaving Bearses Way in Barnstable on this list, [below right, dated September 8, 2000]. Ms. Leclerc described the MHD comments and presented a draft letter for CCJTC review in response to the MHD comments.

After further discussion, the CCJTC voted to recommend endorsement of the TIP as changed to the Cape Cod Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO). The CCJTC also voted to send the response letter to MHD with minor changes.
