Call to Order: Chairman Robert Parady called the meeting to order at 8:32 AM.

### Minutes of December 14, 2001 were approved.

**Transit Summit III:** Clay Schofield, CCC Professional Engineer, gave a brief summary of the third annual transit meeting held recently. He said there were approximately 140 people who attended. The summit was broken down into two sessions—morning and afternoon. The morning session dealt with issues such as implementation, human services, finances and a coordinating council whereas the afternoon's session focus was more educational. A summary of the summit will be on the Web site.

Federal and State funding outlook as related to the Cape Cod Transportation Improvement Program (TIP): Priscilla Leclerc, CCC Senior Transportation Planner, attended a meeting of MARPA and MHD this past Tuesday (3/5). She passed out a handout with TIP related financial information which she compiled from that meeting and went over the pages of her handout explaining the various figures. Priscilla reported that there is \$56 million proposed by MHD to be available for regions statewide—the Cape Cod amount would be \$2.57 million. She said there is a statewide total of 75 million for bridge work. John Blundo, Mass Highway, is putting together a list of bridges for review. On Monday (3/11) she will attend another meeting. On March 15th there will be a vote on what the new funding levels will be for the TIP.

The next scheduled CCJTC meeting is April 5<sup>th</sup>, which is a week earlier as a preliminary draft TIP is scheduled for April 12th.

Priscilla briefly related information on Revenue Aligned Budget Authority (RABA). In the federal legislation, TEA-21 [The Transportation Equity Act for the 21st Century], Federal Highway funds to states are based on actual Highway Trust Fund revenues. In most years this has resulted in additional funding for the state. For example, in FY2002, the RABA, or adjustment, in federal funds for Massachusetts was \$ 14,000,000. In 2003, there is projected to be a deficit in revenues as compared to budgeted amounts that would result in less federal funding for the state; however, legislation has been filed in the United States Congress to correct this deficit.

Priscilla reported that the MassHighway Statewide Road and Bridge Program (SR&B) expenditures in Fiscal Year 2002, as of February 22, 2002, are \$244,524,781 towards the minimum \$400,000,000 spending program. During FY01, expenditures were at \$188,315,174, as of February 19, 2001, a similar point in the previous state fiscal year for comparison.

### Route 6 Safety and Traffic Flow Study:

Lev Malakhoff, CCC Senior Transportation Engineer, gave a recap of the Route 6 Safety & Traffic Flow Study meeting held in Eastham on February 26<sup>th</sup>. His slide presentation on the Route 6 Eastham to Provincetown corridor focused on safety/crash history/crash types, traffic flow, congestion, identifying problem areas/analysis tools. The study showed that Eastham had more vehicles traveling on its stretch of road than the other 3 towns and also had more the number of accidents than all 3 of the other towns combined had. The percentage of crashes on the corridor was 56% Property Damage Only/43% Injury/1% Fatal.

There was a break for questions. Curb cuts, non-intersection numbers, rate of summer vs. winter accidents, breakdown on types of collisions, and the problem of the left lane being used as a passing lane when coming off highway ramps were discussed during this period.

Returning to the slide presentation, Lev showed a traffic simulation demonstration on various traffic flows along the corridor. He said later this spring there would be another meeting on the Route 6 corridor.

A question was asked if there were any bike trail data. Lev said there was old data and they would try to get newer data pertaining to usage of the trail.

Public Comment: None.

**Other Business:** Lev handed out copies of the Federal Highway Administrations "Roundabouts—An Informational Guide" to the CCJTC members and Priscilla also handed out "SFY2001-2006 State Bond Cap Allocation—Revised as of October 1, 2001".

Priscilla said MassHighway has a Web site that now includes projects by town.
